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My conventions for abstracting the USCensus are defined [here](#).

Abstracts are in order by state, county, and township, within census year.

Judy's ancestral line from Elias Allen begins in CortlandCoNY, and shifts to SteubenCoNY by 1850.

Coni's runs through Henry of SomersetCoNJ then OrangeCoNY. This Henry had a brother David.

These two lines appear to converge when Harriet E[lizabeth] Allen, a niece of Coni's ancestor Zelotes, and the daughter of his brother Henry C. Allen (who resides in the same SteubenCoNY family as Zelotes in 1850) married Judy's grandfather, William Edson Allen of SteubenCo (see below: Harriet E, aged 7, in Henry C's 1880 household, and Harriet E, aged 27, in William's 1900household). For that reason, I've consolidated the US and NY Census abstracts for the two of them into this one report.

Even though these ALLEN lines converge thus recently, it would be a mistake to make the usual assumption: that William and Harriet were known to each other to be cousins, and were therefore especially predisposed to marriage (in colonial and early America, even first cousin marriages were quite common). In this case, the yDNA of the male patrilineal descendants of these two lines are so disparate that their earliest known ancestors, born in the 18<sup>th</sup> century, were themselves at best probably about 6<sup>th</sup> cousins of each other, while their modern representatives are probably about 12<sup>th</sup> cousins.

We know from Henry's Revolutionary War pension papers that he was born in SomersetCoNJ on 28Nov1756, and that he ended up in Minisink, OrangeCoNY.

Judy has been actively researching the maternal ALLEN line she shares with Coni, and I've pitched in a bit too. Judy has found two highly useful wills in OrangeCoNY (the locus of Minisink): the 7Dec1840 will of Henry's brother David, and the 8Dec1843 will of their married sister, Martha Rackett. David's will appears to include specific bequests to all of his legal heirs (his widow and children), while all of Martha's bequests are to children or either David or Henry, and since Martha apparently died unmarried and childless, an accompanying legal notice recorded for her estate in the probate books and published in the local newspaper appears to identify all of Martha's legal heirs, which would include all of the children of Henry, David, and any other living siblings (or their heirs) whom she might have had.

As [these abstracts](#) show, both Henry and David headed households in the 1840 USCensus for OrangeCo. Martha's will makes it clear that Henry was deceased by 8Dec1843, yet there are apparently no probate records for him—not even an administration on his estate. This doesn't mean that Henry didn't die in the county or was indigent. His birth date indicates that he was already 83 when the 1840 census was taken, and even though he was by courtesy recorded as head of his own household, it's likely that he had already passed on all but a modicum of personal property to his heirs, and what remained fell below the threshold required to mandate any probate process.

The [1810 USCensus records for OrangeCo](#) show that both Henry and David were established in the county by then, but the grantee/grantor deeds indexes indicate that only David ever owned any land in the county—land that he purchased on 19Apr1817. David's land consisted of two apparently non-contiguous lots in the Wawayanda Patent, one of some 80.25a, and the other of 8a. David devised his land to his son Joseph S. Allen in his will, and Joseph promptly sold most of it a few months later to pay his siblings their shares of David's estate. However, Joseph retained a portion of this land and he and his unmarried sister Maria, who was her Aunt Martha's principal heir, were still residents of the county, and next door neighbors, in both the [1850](#) and the [1860 USCensuses](#). That they continued to live on a portion of their father's land is also indicated by their, and earlier their father David's, neighbors—see my notes to [David's 1830 census record](#).

He is as expected born in NY. He is of an age to be a nephew of Martha through one of her two known brothers, Henry and David, both deceased by 1843. This Gideon headed a SenecaCo household in 1840 as well, but would have been too young for that role in 1830.

I've abstracted David's closest neighbors in 1830 since he and they are associated too in other documentary evidence: Squire Lee witnessed David's 1817 deed of purchase in the Wawayanda Patent (witnesses to deeds were typically adjacent landowners), and Philip and Isaac Lee witnessed his 1840 will; later, in the 1850 USCensus, John Duncan's probable widow Margaret (aged 53, widow), was next door neighbor to David's daughter Maria, and she was next to David's son [Joseph] Smith Allen, who inherited is father's land in 1841. Maria[h] and Joseph S[mith] Allen were still next door neighbors in 1860, though the Duncan's have been replaced by a household headed by John McBride. Maria appears also in the 1870 census (PO Unionville), and last in 1880, still a next door neighbor to the McBrides. [Maria is buried in a cemetery near the hamlet of Westtown.](#)

[The fifth map on this page](#), published by the Minisink Historical Society, shows the relative location of the Wawayanda Patent, and the location of Unionville to the south, on the NJ border. [Other maps](#) show Westtown to be about five miles to the northwest of Unionville, just about at the point where the southwestern corner of the Wawayanda Patent joins the easternmost corner of the Minisink Patent: this is presumably where David Allen and his children lived most of their lives.
